



Colorado Heights University Scholarship Policy

Colorado Heights University offers merit-based scholarships to first time applicants and continuing students.

First time applicants must submit Admission Application and all documents required by the Admissions Office. If applicant is accepted into CHU BA or MBA Program, the Scholarship Selection Committee will review applicant's transcript from previous school(s) to determine eligibility and amount of scholarship. Each individual applicant will be notified of the scholarship offer along with the Admissions Acceptance Letter. Scholarship offer will reflect total amount of scholarship to be applied to each of the next two subsequent semesters within the academic year.

Example: an applicant receives \$1,000 offer to be applied in two equal \$500 amounts for the next two semesters within the academic year.

- Following is the BA applicant scholarship chart based on CGPA and tuition for full-time enrollment:
 - 3.250-3.599 = 13% of tuition
 - 3.600-3.700 = 15% of tuition
 - 3.701-3.800 = 17% of tuition
 - 3.801-3.900 = 19% of tuition
 - 3.901-3.999 = 21% of tuition
 - 4.000 = 24% of tuition
- Following is the MBA applicant scholarship chart based on CGPA and tuition for full-time enrollment:
 - 3.250-3.749 = 10% of tuition
 - 3.750-3.799 = 15% of tuition
 - 3.800-3.899 = 18% of tuition
 - 3.900-3.999 = 20% of tuition
 - 4.000 = 24% of tuition

All continuing BA or MBA students are eligible for merit-based scholarship if they meet following requirements:

- Full time enrollment of 12 credit hours for the BA program and 9 credit hours for the MBA Program.
- Good standing with the Business Office as required by the Business Office Payment Policy at all times.
- BA returning students must meet minimum 3.600 CGPA for the previous academic year. Example: CGPA is 3.600 for academic year ending Spring 2011. Student is eligible for scholarship offer for Fall 2011 and Spring 2012. The total amount is applied in two equal semester amounts within the academic year.
- MBA returning student must meet minimum 3.750 CGPA for the previous academic year. Example: CGPA is 3.750 for academic year ending Spring 2011. Student is eligible for scholarship offer for Fall 2011 and Spring 2012. The total amount is applied in two equal semester amounts within the academic year.
- A student must remain full-time student for the academic year for which scholarship was offered.
- A student must remain in good standing with Business Office Payment Policy for the academic year for which scholarship was offered.
- The scholarship amount cannot be appealed, changed, transferred or postponed.
- Scholarship offered is good for one academic year. Should a student take a semester off or drops below full-time enrollment, a student will be re-evaluated for a scholarship prior to re-enrolling.
- Following is the BA returning student scholarship chart based on CGPA and tuition for full time enrollment:
 - 3.600-3.700 = 15% of tuition
 - 3.701-3.800 = 17% of tuition
 - 3.801-3.900 = 19% of tuition
 - 3.901-3.999 = 21% of tuition
 - 4.000 = 24% of tuition
- Following is the MBA returning student scholarship chart based on CGPA and tuition for full time enrollment:
 - 3.750-3.799 = 15% of tuition
 - 3.800-3.899 = 18% of tuition
 - 3.900-3.999 = 20% of tuition
 - 4.000 = 24% of tuition
- A scholarship offer will be communicated to each individual student recipient no later than the first day of the registration period.
- All scholarship decisions are made by the Scholarship Committee.
- All scholarship amounts are rounded-up or down to the nearest dollar.

Q&A

- Q: Do I have to register for full-time enrollment as an applicant before a scholarship offer is made?
- A: No, a scholarship offer is made at the time of acceptance and before registration is completed.
- Q: I graduated from TJ High School in Denver, CO and my CGPA is 3.628. Am I eligible for scholarship?
- A: Yes, you will be offered 15% scholarship for the 2011-2012 academic year for a total of \$626 with \$313 applied for Fall 2011 and \$313 applied for Spring 2012.
- Q: I finished sophomore year in Spring 2011 with 3.872 CGPA. I have been enrolled with CHU full time since freshman year. I am out-of-state student. What scholarship amount am I eligible for?
- A: You will be offered 19% scholarship for 2011-2012 academic year for a total of \$1820 with \$910 applied for Fall 2010 and \$910 applied for Spring 2012.
- Q: I am an in-state MBA student and received \$1550 offer for 2011-2012 academic year. I have personal issues that prevent me from attending full-time in Fall 2011. Am I eligible for scholarship offered?
- A: You are not eligible for scholarship unless you enroll full-time for Fall 2011. When you re-enroll full time you will be re-evaluated for scholarship eligibility.
- Q: I am an out-of-state MBA student enrolled full time for Summer semester 2011. My CGPA is 3.925 Am I eligible for scholarship for Summer semester?
- A: A CHU academic year is defined as period of formal academic instruction, extending from August through May. It is divided into fall and spring semesters. Students may also be able to take classes during summer sessions; however Summer is not a part of the standard academic year for scholarship purpose.
- Q: I am an in-state MBA student and have total of 15 credits to graduate. I will register for 9 credits (full-time) for Fall 2011 and plan to finish last 6 credits (half-time) in Spring 2012. I meet all other scholarship requirements. Am I eligible for scholarship for both semesters?
- A: You are not eligible for scholarship. You must meet full-time enrollment requirement at all times to be eligible.
- Q: I am a full-time BA student and plan to register for Fall 2011. I would like to register for 15 credits. Do I qualify for higher scholarship based on higher number of credits that I am taking?
- A: No, a scholarship applies to full-time enrollment only for both BA and MBA students. Taking more credit does not increase your scholarship amount.
