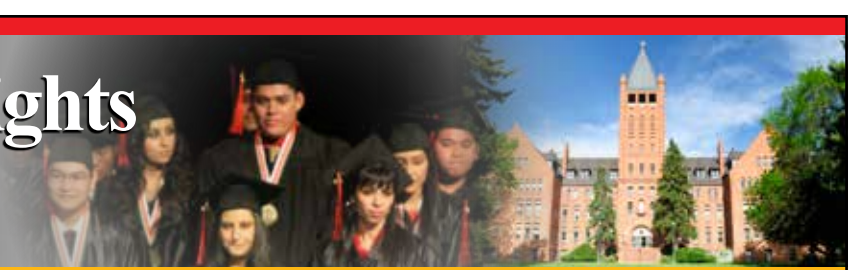

Sponsoring University

Program Format

The program is constructed of six modules that concentrate on both English language skills and academic business practices. Students participate in intensive English language training each morning, followed by advanced business courses such as accounting, finance and international business in the afternoon.



For two of the 8-week sessions, courses in grant-writing and technical proposal writing will be added to augment the executive level practical business skills training.

Housing and Tuition

Housing

Participants in the program can choose to live in the CHU Residence Halls or off campus. Students who live in the residence halls on campus enjoy the convenience of living close to their classrooms, the library and administrative staff.



Residing on campus is a great opportunity to meet other students, develop friendships and be part of ongoing activities each day.

Use of amenities such as an air conditioned student lounge, sports fields, Olympic-size pool and work-out facilities, coin-operated laundry facilities, full-size shared kitchen and a shared big-screen TV are available to all residents.

Campus security is operational 24-hours a day, seven days a week to provide a secure and safe environment.

Dorm Room Rates

Participants will be paired together with a roommate in a dorm room on campus. Rooms are equipped with WiFi, 2 beds, a desk, chairs and closet. Students can choose to pay an additional charge for a TV and mini-fridge.



- Cost for a shared room is paid in advance and starts at \$150 per month. (Prices and available room options are subject to change without notice.)
- Students will be issued a key at time of move in. If lost, there is a \$50 replacement fee.
- \$200 security deposit is due at the time of move-in and may be returned at the time of move out.
- \$100 nonrefundable application fee, due at time of move-in.
- \$25 PO Box fee - paid at the beginning of each semester.
- Costs to rent TV or mini-fridge ranges from \$25 - \$45 per semester, depending on the size of item.

Stipend

Select, high-achieving students, as result of participation in the development of new technical proposals, may be eligible for small living expense stipend opportunities. This is only a possibility for the most highly qualified and highly performing students. The companies involved, and not Colorado Heights University, will decide on, offer and administer this stipend using qualifying criteria and budgets internal to those companies.



Visa

Participants will be issued an I-20 to travel to the United States on an F-1 visa. At the conclusion of the program, the student has options:

- Students can extend the F-1 visa upon enrolling into the Colorado Heights University MBA program.
- Students can return home to their employer country.
- Students can transition to a cap subject or cap exempt H-1B depending on the project type and association.

Colorado Heights University does not provide governance on visas other than the F-1 non-immigrant class.
